Sample Pathfinder: Gay & Lesbian Issues

The following is a sample pathfinder originally developed as a guide to information on the topic of "Homosexuality", available in or accessible from Kelvin High School's Library. This information guide is updated semi-annually.

Books

Books in Kelvin Library's collection can be found by searching the automated catalogue, using any of the following key words: *homosexuality, lesbian, gay*. Starting in September 2000, a complete listing of books on the topic can be obtained by choosing the "Visual Search" function, and then clicking on the "LGB" button.

Kelvin Library users can also connect directly to the Winnipeg Public Library and search its catalogue. Once in the WPL catalogue, select the "Main Words in Subject" option, and use the same key words as used for searching books in Kelvin's collection.

Magazines/Journal Articles

Magazine articles dealing with current issues can be found by searching the *Ebscohost Magazine Articles Summaries* product, either in its CD-ROM format or via its Internet-delivered form. Most current news magazines (*Maclean's, Time, Newsweek, U.S. News and World Report*) are available in Kelvin's Library. Use the key words listed above in the Books section, to search for magazine articles.

Mina Rosner Human Rights Award

The Mina Rosner Human Rights Award will be given for the best essays discussing the Holocaust and other gross violations of human rights. The winning essays should exemplify the message that Mina Rosner brought to schools and to the general public. Essays of 1000 – 1500 words must be neatly typed and presented and will be judged for presentation of issues, research, sincerity, coherence and writing skills.

There will be separate competitions for grades 7 – 9 and grades 10 – 12. Prizes in each category will be \$100 for the best essay and \$50 for each runner up. Essays will not be returned.

Mina Rosner grew up in Buchach, now in Ukraine, and was the sole member of her family to survive the Holocaust. She moved to Winnipeg in 1948, recorded her experiences in the book *I am a Witness*, and devoted countless hours to educating people about the horrors of the Holocaust.
