Summer Reading with Winnipeg Public Library

This summer there are lots of exciting programs at your Winnipeg Public Library branches!

This year the theme for our reading booklet program is **Catch a Dragon by the Tale**. Kids can come to the library starting June 23 and receive their activity booklet, bookmarks, and a two-for-one voucher for a **Library Night with the Winnipeg Goldeyes**.

There are three different booklets available. The first is a booklet to record family reading for children who are read to. The second is a primary grade level booklet and the third is geared for upper elementary children. The goal of our summer reading program is to encourage reading and to keep up children's interest in reading over the summer months.

Your library branch offers free programs full of fun which encourage participation and reading. Special guests like **JJ, the Juggling Fool**, the Dramatic Duo from Manitoba Theatre for Young People and storytellers **Rebecca Hiebert** and **Leigh Anne Kehler** will visit various branches. Book and storytelling programs will also be

presented by library staff for various age levels and **Winnipeg Goldeyes** players will also read to families at selected libraries. Just check out the program guide available at your branch or visit our newly designed web site at <http://wpl.winnipeg.ca>.

The library is also sponsoring the **Read Aloud Program** at ten branches. The branches in the Winnipeg School Division are **St. John's, Centennial, Sir William**

Stephenson and **West End**. The objective of this program is to bring children and books together so that early readers (aged 6 to 10) can practice their reading skills over the summer. Children are

partnered with trained teen volunteers for shared reading.

I look forward to hearing from you and we hope that you can promote the summer programs at your school!

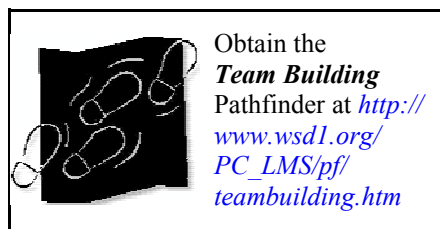
