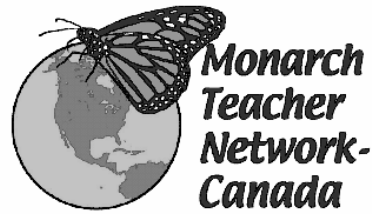


Join Us for an Incredible Journey

Each fall, monarch butterflies from Manitoba begin a 4000km migration to Mexico. The following spring, their great-great grandchildren return to Manitoba. This summer, an exciting opportunity for teachers is coming to Manitoba too.

The powerful story of the monarch butterfly inspired the emergence of the Monarch Teacher Network in New Jersey in 2001 and its affiliate Monarch Teacher Network-Canada in 2004.

'Teaching and Learning With Monarch Butterflies' is a three-day workshop combining classroom and field experiences which will inspire N - grade 8 teachers to bring the Monarch story to the classroom through literacy, math, science, the arts, geography and social studies.

The workshops are taught collaboratively by a team of experienced educators from Manitoba, Ontario and New Jersey. Participating teachers are provided with the knowledge, experience, materials and confidence to raise monarchs in their classrooms in September and create an outstanding learning experience for their students. Participants can also apply for fellowship awards to visit the monarch over-wintering sites in Mexico.
