Hello Mike,

Thank you for your interest in our policy regarding AP courses. While we do not have a general policy for AP the way we do for IB courses, we do grant courses-by-course credit for several courses. To date, we have assessed 25 AP courses in chemistry, Latin, German, history, politics, physics, art, mathematics, computer science, French, English and biology. The grading scale is applied as follows:

5 = A  
4 = B  
3 = C  
2 = no credit  
1 = no credit

The exception to the above scale is in the botany department, where students must have a grade of 4 or better to receive any credit.

I hope this information will help you to prepare for your parent evening next week. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me again. I will be away next week, as that is our midterm break.
