

YOU NEED:


- Photographs of weather.
- Art reproductions by Canadian artists like Ted Harrison or Group of Seven
- Art supplies: White paper & black glue, chalk pastels, watercolors
OR Black paper & white glue, chalk pastels

3. DRAW YOUR OWN WEATHER CONDITION PICTURE WITH LINES

- Choose white OR black paper.
- Use a pencil to draw weather lines in the sky. Try to show the movement of the weather condition. Keep your drawing big and bold, for the lines will be covered with glue. *Look at work by Ted Harrison for examples of big , bold lines in the sky.*
- Include a landscape with a low horizon line . Most of the picture should show sky.
- If you used white paper, trace over all your lines with a thin line of black glue.
*Make black glue with about 5 parts white glue and 1 part good quality acrylic paint.
Put the mixture into a squeeze bottle or small plastic bag (snip off a corner to use).*
- If you used black paper, trace over all your lines with a thin line of white glue.
- Let the glue lines dry overnight.

4. PLAN THE COLORS FOR YOUR WEATHER PICTURE

- Experiment with paints and chalk pastels on scrap paper to create the following color combinations. Check each one that you have experimented with:

COLOR CONTRASTS are color combinations that use opposites:

_____HOT and COLD colors together, like yellow and blue

_____COMPLIMENTARY colors together, like green and red, or violet and yellow.

_____BRIGHT, pure colors together with DULL, muddy colors

COLOR BLENDS are colors that are similar to each other:

_____ANALOGOUS colors are next to each other on the color wheel, like red, red-orange and orange .

_____MONOCHROMATIC colors are all the same hue, like light, medium and dark green.

_____TINTED COLORS are colors mixed with white to make them light, or pastel like.

_____SHADED COLORS are colors mixed with black to make them dark and shady.

5. COLOR YOUR WEATHER PICTURE

- If your paper is black, use chalk pastels to color your picture. Blend and smudge the pastels to create weather colors. Use an eraser to remove lines. When the chalk work is finished, it can be sprayed with inexpensive hair spray to keep it from smudging.
- If your paper is white, use any or all of the following materials to color your work:
Liquid Watercolors and salt Pan Watercolors
Block tempera paints Chalk pastels
